Preparing for the Upcoming Motorcycle Season ...Contingency Planning

We all have a number of years of riding experience under our belts. So, we all have unique experiences which influences how we prepare for a motorcycle ride. What I am going to talk about may seem very fundamental, but I thought this would be a good topic to start preparing for the upcoming motorcycle season.

I am going to talk about contingency planning...notice I did not say emergency planning. Emergency planning is a whole different discussion which is a good idea but is not relevant here. I am just talking about the contingency planning and preparing for a motorcycle ride as well as reviewing and updating preparations made in past riding seasons. This includes fixing or replacing old or worn-out items. We all do this but may have never formalized the concept into an action plan. Your contingency plans will be different if you are going to ride across Canada, by yourself, or if you are going for a Sunday morning group ride to the neighbourhood Café for a Latté.

Like I said, we already do this to some degree. You look at the weather forecast to determine the type of riding gear to wear or bring along, if you should pack your rain gear, if you should pack extra layers of warm cloths, or if you will need sunglasses and sunscreen. You plan your route (maybe) as well as how long the ride should take. You think about potential fuel stops; potential rest stops; or road trip milestone hotels or campsites, for the night – maybe you will have to also plan for the contingency of spending the night at the side of the road. You think about communications options...either to 1) let people know you are OK; 2) let people know where you are and update them as to when you expect to return; 3) or you need to reach out for help.

You should also think about the safety of your motorcycle. This includes maintenance of fluid levels and tire pressures; as well as the overall condition to complete the ride without mechanical failure. Motorcycle repairs should also a contingency plan...where are the closest dealerships, if required or to just stop in and say Hi! Maybe it would be a good idea to have, on hand, tools and spare parts to be able to conduct maintenance tasks or repairs. Notice I did not specify the level of sophistication required to complete the maintenance tasks or repairs as this will be dependent on your abilities and skills.

Some other contingency plans include:

• Having an Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK)...again, the components of the IFAK will depend on personal abilities, skills, as well as the comfort level when dealing with trauma (either your own or someone else). I would like to suggest everyone should at least take a basic (i.e. Level 1) first aid training course and have some basic First Aid supplies on hand.

- Packing some food (i.e. high energy meal replacement bars, freeze dried camping meals, or military Meals Ready to Eat [aka MRE's]) as well as water or sports drinks.
- Carrying a spare set of keys.
- Carrying extra fuel.
- Bringing along personal comfort items...riding a motorcycle is the art of travelling light but that does not mean being uncomfortable (which can become a safety issue)...again personal comfort items are individual specific...like packing your woobie...

Everyone's contingency plans are decisions/choices based on personal experiences, abilities and skills, as well as their type of motorcycle (be it a Tri Glide® Ultra, Ultra Limited®, or Forty-Eight®).

Remember...everyone's decisions/choices are correct...if you find a contingency plan does not adequately cover the contingency, it can always be modified. That being said, I always enjoy listening to the advice of other riders as they may have experienced something I have not or may have a different point of view of a similar experience. Their suggestions could save me lot of frustration, headache, and the possibility of a very miserable ride...which I am sure we have all had at some point in the past.
